## **Pine Bend Refinery Fire Department Marks 25 Years**

### *Premier training facility and partnerships celebrated*

**Rosemount, Minn.** – On Saturday, August 27, Flint Hills Resources’ Pine Bend refinery celebrated the silver jubilee of its two-house fire department. When it was first established in the early 1990s, the Pine Bend refinery had six firefighters. Today, the department has 132 firefighters, including 87 volunteers. “Not every oil refinery has its own fire department, and we’re especially proud because ours is among the best in the industry,” said Jon Carlson, manufacturing manager of the Pine Bend refinery. “The Pine Bend fire department not only helps keep our employees and our facility safe, they also collaborate with mutual aid partners to promote public safety in the broader community.”

Over the last 25 years, the Pine Bend refinery fire department has become a premier training facility. Pine Bend regularly provides mutual aid industrial fire training to firefighters from the Rosemount, Eagan, Inver Grove Heights, and Hastings fire departments, who have been using the refinery’s fire training grounds for free since 1991.
