Eagan Students Awarded Math and Science Scholarships From Flint Hills Resources

Students to be recognized for achievements at June scholarship banquet

ROSEMOUNT, Minn. – Eagan High School seniors Kellie Bohlig and Lars Johnson were awarded Discovery Scholarships from Flint Hills Resources Pine Bend. This is the 20th year Flint Hills has provided scholarships to college-bound local students pursuing careers in math and science.

A total of 26 students from 13 schools in Dakota County each received a \$2,500 scholarship for the 2011-2012 school year. The scholarship recipients were chosen based on demonstrated leadership and entrepreneurial skills, and each had a cumulative GPA of 3.6 or higher.
