Thousands of Dakota County Third Graders Take Field Trips to the Minnesota Zoo

Students follow a syllabus that fulfills STEM curriculum requirements

Apple Valley, Minn. – More than 2,000 third grade students from School District 196 are learning to think like scientists and wildlife conservationists by participating in the Zoo Safari program at the Minnesota Zoo – made possible by a partnership with Flint Hills Resources that first began in 1989.

The program allows third graders from District 196 to experience the zoo while following a syllabus that aligns with state STEM curriculum standards. These field trips spark students' interest in science and promote academic achievement. The field trip is free for all third grade students, and for some, the Minnesota Zoo Safari field trip is their first and only visit to any zoo.
